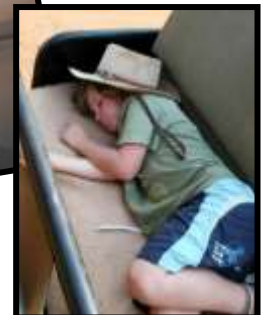
With the completion of the new community school in December 2007, due to open early this year (see the "before" and the "after") this is a real highlight for Kasaka and the village people alike.
